THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Let us pray. O Lord, you have taught us that without love whatever we do is worth nothing: Send your Holy Spirit and pour into our hearts your greatest gift, which is love, the true bond of peace and of all virtue, without which whoever lives is accounted dead before you. Grant this for the sake of your only Son Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

THE FIRST READING: Genesis 45:3-11, 15

Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph. Is my father still alive?" But his brothers could not answer him, so dismayed were they at his presence.

Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come closer to me." And they came closer. He said, "I am your brother, Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt. And now do not be distressed, or angry with yourselves, because you sold me here; for God sent me before you to preserve life. For the famine has been in the land these two years; and there are five more years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors. So it was not you who sent me here, but God; he has made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house and ruler over all the land of Egypt. Hurry and go up to my father and say to him, "Thus says your son Joseph, God has made me lord of all Egypt; come down to me, do not delay. You shall settle in the land of Goshen, and you shall be near me, you and your children and your children's children, as well as your flocks, your herds, and all that you have. I will provide for you there--since there are five more years of famine to come--so that you and your household, and all that you have, will not come to poverty."

Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. Thanks be to God.

THE PSALM: Psalm 37:1-12, 41-42

1 Do not fret yourself because of evil 'doers; *
do not be jealous of those who do wrong.
2 For they shall soon wither like the grass, *
and like the green grass fade a'way.
3 Put your trust in the Lord and do 'good; *
dwell in the land and feed on its ' riches.
4 Take delight in the 'Lord, *
and he shall give you your heart's de'sire.
5 Commit your way to the Lord and put your trust in ' him, *
and he will bring it to ' pass.
6 He will make your righteousness as clear as the ' light *

7 Be still before the 'Lord * and wait patiently for ' him. 8 Do not fret yourself over the one who ' prospers, * the one who succeeds in evil ' schemes. 9 Refrain from anger, leave rage a'lone; * do not fret yourself; it leads only to 'evil. 10 For evildoers shall be cut ' off, * but those who wait upon the Lord shall possess the 'land. 11 In a little while the wicked shall be no 'more; * you shall search out their place, but they will not be ' there. 12 But the lowly shall possess the 'land; * they will delight in abundance of ' peace. 41 But the deliverance of the righteous comes from the 'Lord; * he is their stronghold in time of ' trouble. 42 The Lord will help them and rescue ' them; * he will rescue them from the wicked and deliver them, because they seek refuge in ' him.

THE SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:35-38, 42-50

Someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" Fool! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. And as for what you sow, you do not sow the body that is to be, but a bare seed, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body.

So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body. Thus it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. But it is not the spiritual that is first, but the physical, and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. As was the man of dust, so are those who are of the dust; and as is the man of heaven, so are those who are of heaven. Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we will also bear the image of the man of heaven.

What I am saying, brothers and sisters, is this: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. Thanks be to God.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 6:27-38

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said, "I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you.

"If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back."

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. The deduction is worth 5% of what you gave....no matter how small, or large, the amount. For example, if you donated \$2000 to the Cathedral last year, your refund would be increased by \$100. Just remember to give the "Donations Statement" that you received a few weeks ago to whomever is doing your taxes. This does not apply to your Federal taxes - only your MA taxes.
